Maybe you noticed, but I'm new to Indian Motorcycle. I started as president in December 2019, but I've been with Polaris, Indian Motorcycle's parent company, since 1998. Not coincidentally, that was the year I got my motorcycle license. The company had just launched Victory, and I wanted to experience it. Right away, I was hooked. I've been on a bike ever since, riding some of the greatest routes in the world, from Highway 1 in California to the Great Ocean Road in Australia to the fjords of Norway.

For a long time, I rode a Victory Hammer. But then in 2015, when we relaunched the Scout, there was no way I wasn't buying one. I got mine in a matte black finish. It's the seventh Scout off of the production line, which means it has an amazing serial number: 007. I use it mostly for commuting or cruising around the lakes on the west side of the Twin Cities with my son. Last year I picked up an FTR, and now that's the bike I ride more than any other. I like the style and the aggressive stance. For me, bikes are



about choosing to stand out. About having fun. The FTR is the epitome of that.

This is, no exaggeration, a dream job for me. I'm lucky to be a part of Indian Motorcycle, and I hope you feel that way, too. I get to work with the best motorcycle brand in the world-and with the best motorcycle riders in the world.

You all made a choice when you bought an Indian Motorcycle-to escape conformity by joining a legendary brand and a group of riders who make their own rules. We're proud to share your passion. That's why we announced updates to IMRG in 2020 to make it easier for you-and for usto interact with, learn from, and ride alongside the 36,000 IMRG members around the world. And we continue to make improvements on the way we communicate with and engage all owners moving forward.



Providing a perfect balance of comfort, control and agility, the FTR Carbon combines long travel (150mm) fully adjustable suspension with a commanding, upright riding position for predictable, precise cornering and city manoeuvrability. The smooth, liquid-cooled 1203cc V-twin engine, developing 93 kW of power and 120 Nm of torque, has an impressively flat torque curve and strong acceleration throughout the RPM range. Progressive, predictable power delivery and plenty offlexible low-end punch make for an exhilarating riding experience whether commuting, slicing through the city, or escaping to the countryside. For improved confidence and control, leanangle sensitive stability control, ABS, traction control, and wheelie mitigation control can be modified by three Ride Modes (Sport, Standard, Rain) providing unique throttle responses and traction control intervention levels.

The 2020 FTR Carbon is compatible with the extensive range of 40+ accessories specifically developed for the FTR platform, giving riders the ability to further customise their FTR with an almost endless combination of stylish and practical options.



There are as many reasons to ride a motorcycle as there are roads to ride. Maybe you're a speed nut, or a corner hound, an AC/DC-blasting city slow roller. Maybe your weekends feel wasted if they're not spent on a massive touring trip. You might be a "Hop on, we're going for a ride," or a "Buzz off, I need some time to myself," kind of person. It doesn't matter. We're all individuals, but we also chose to be a part of a larger group: Indian Motorcycle riders. We wanted to know just how Indian Motorcycle riders were using and loving their bikes. So we asked. Here are

So we asked. Here are the stories of european riders, all of whom share one immediate connection: the constant pull to be behind the handlebars.

<< I found a dealership in Lynnwood, north of Seattle. One of the guys there, David, really got me - he understood the dream I'd been harbouring for so long. In 2017 my wife and I found ourselves in Seattle on my Springfield, after a warm welcome and superb service from David and his colleagues at Indian in Lynnwood. We were setting off on the road trip that I'd been dreaming of for 40 years. The next day we were in Vancouver, and then we headed up into the Canadian Rockies. After a week we turned back to the US and made for the Pacific coast before taking off into the heart of the West to check out all the

amazing things there are to see there. We got to ride through sunshine, rain, even snow - but our Indian never protested! She became our "Lady in Red". After our grand tour, we flew out of Denver back to the Netherlands, leaving our Springfield behind and safely stored. 2018 saw us back in the States to complete the second part of our adventure. After we'd had our Lady in Red serviced by the fantastic team at G-Force Powersports in Lakewood, we headed north to the Black Hills and from there we set out on an epic journey through South Dakota, Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan and the Great Lakes. Our end point was Toronto.







Then we brought our Lady in Red back to Amsterdam with us, where she's settled in at our house, and is always up for an outing. Our local dealership, Motoport Hengelo, takes great care of her. I'm absolutely sure that Robert Pirsig would have loved this motorbike. He took a great interest in the quality of a motorcycle, and wrote a lot about it – and our Lady in Red perfectly epitomizes that quality.

By the time I'd reached fifty, I'd given up motorbikes for the comfort and practicality of a scooter, but I never really got into it, I always felt something was missing ... One beautiful sunny day in Corsica, I decided to go back to my first love and get back on a motorbike. I'd just hit 65, so I needed comfort and torque. My closest friend works as a salesman in an American motorcycle showroom, so I called him to ask for advice on choosing a machine. He instantly said: "You want a great bike? Go to Indian!... Here, we've lost our soul..." I'll admit I hadn't heard of Indian, but as far as bikes go, I trusted him completely. I went online, read some reviews, learned about the brand and its history and got totally hooked. When I called the dealership in Toulon, on the mainland, they told me they had a used Scout Sixty. A good choice for returning to motorcycling, very beautiful - black and grey - and I had to have



it. So two weeks later, I rediscovered the joy of riding a motorbike. After another nine months, though, I got fired up with the idea of travelling further afield, going away for several days with my girlfriend... I rang the dealer in Toulon again, telling him I wanted to upgrade. He happened to have a Springfield demonstration model in, and again, I fell in love with it. So I went over on my Scout and returned home with my new Springfield. I've come to feel a real connection with it, as we ride along the roads of Corsica together every day. My girlfriend and I have loads of trips planned on this bike. I'm 67 years old, but I feel 40 years younger when I ride my Springfield!! I bought both of my "Indians" sight unseen, just on blind faith, and they both brought me huge happiness.

SCOUT BOBBER



This leather riding jacket has classic styling with modern features, like ventilation zips to keep you cool in warmer temperatures, and a subtle contrast-suede logo on the back. The low-profile protectors are slim and lightweight. They're practically imperceptible. (opposite page, top left)

HEADDRESS HOODIE

Soft, comfortable, and proud, with Indian Motorcycle graphics on the front and back. (opposite, top right)

SOFTSHELL CASUAL JACKET

A hooded jacket with a fleece interior provides both warmth and wind resistance on cooler days. (opposite, lower left)
